






- Lack of basic services:


# Place Making for Identity Migrants

#### Factors that Militate Against Inclusivity Misplaced Policies

- Misplaced policies (such as the bull-dozer approach)are not responsive to people's needs.
- Involves wastage of resources both on the part of beneficiaries and on the part of government.
- Livelihoods are disrupted in the process.
- Accessibility to opportunities and services are equally compromised for people in all domains



#### Force Eviction



- Force eviction: Most cases they are unconstitutional and Inhumane.
